The branches will receive the changes about 90 days before the National meeting. Please take the time to review the changes and cast your vote. It is important that every branch vote on these changes. If your branch is not attending the National meeting, please, make sure to return your vote to the National Secretary/Treasurer in time for it to be counted at the National meeting.

Branch 22 has been working hard to make the 2004 National show one of the best ever.

EDGETA Insurance Highlights

We are still awaiting word on how much the insurance premiums will be for the upcoming year. As soon as we know we will pass it on to the membership. Until we know different, branches should send in their branch dues and insurance premium based on last years total of \$8.80 per member.

We have made progress in making it easier for branches to send in their Events Lists and to request Additional Insured Certificates from the insurance carrier. Now both forms are set up on the Internet (www.edgeta.org, under insurance) so you can fill in the blanks and submit them directly to the insurance agent. I get a copy as well as the insurance agent. You will in turn get a copy of what you have sent. In the past I forwarded each list or request to the insurance agent. The Events list has been simplified to eliminate the columns for home show, away show, and EDGETA branch numbers. The insurance carrier no longer requires this information.

If you would rather keep an Excel spread sheet of your events, you can submit it to me as you have done in the past. If that works better for you, it works for us. Please be sure you have your branch number, your email address if you have one, the date you submit it, and columns for the event date, name of the show, city, and state on your spreadsheet. When I get it I will pass it on to the insurance carrier. If you do not have Internet access, you may still send them by regular mail, or fax them to me. However, we would prefer you use the email method if at all possible.

Please remember to report every event/show any member of your branch might attend so that they will have insurance coverage when they do attend the show. Events/shows that are not reported will not have coverage for your members. Each branch is responsible to report the events attended by their members. Even though it is reported by another branch, it does not count for your branch members.

Also remember that all participants, exhibitors, and demonstrators must be EDGETA members. And each participating Branch must report the event for their members to be covered. If there is an accident involving a spectator as a result of a non-member action, the insurance claim will be denied. It will then be left to the nonmember to settle the claim. The cost of the insurance coverage is cheap for the amount of coverage we have. For the protection of all it is advisable to be sure all participants, exhibitors, and demonstrators are members.

EDGE & TA INSURANCE QUESTIONS By Larry Voris Director at Large

Do you understand what coverage we have? I thought I did but I am finding out I didn't understand completely what we had. Let's set up a show and maybe it will explain how it works.

1. First every show must be reported to the National Insurance representative/the Insurance Company to have insurance coverage for the members.

2. Now when we go to the show, what is covered and how does the coverage work.

a) Every EDGETA member has liability insurance covering him or her if they cause injury to a non-member or damage a non-members property.

b) If a member causes injury to another member or damage to another members property. EDGE does not pay for this accident.

c) It is up to the members to settle the damages between themselves. This means that every member must have his own insurance in place. You're own hospital insurance to cover your own injuries and your own liability to cover the other person if the accident was your fault. You pay for the damages to your equipment.

3. Another scenario is if one of our members has a show on his property. How is he covered?

a) First he must have the show reported to the Club Events Officer and the show must be reported to the National Insurance Representative/Insurance Company as a Club sponsored event.

a) The host of the show should request the "Additional Insured Certificate" from the National EDGETA Insurance Company. There is no charge for this additional coverage. This coverage puts the landowner on the National EDGETA insurance policy. In other words it provides liability protection to the property owner in case a claim would be filed. Also the landowner should check with their homeowner's policy and make sure his personal insurance is in place.

b) Then, when we go to this person's property, every person that exhibits something must be a member of an EDGETA club.

Another Question and Answer:

Question: "If an owner/member of the property (where a EDGETA sponsored event is taking place) lets his neighbor show a piece of equipment and the neighbor is not a member of EDGETA - does that void the insurance for the whole show or just the person that is not a member."

Answer: It does not void the insurance for the whole show, but obviously that non-member is not covered by the insurance should there be an incident arising from his actions. EDGETA Insurance would respond (cover) the branch and it's paid up members. However the nonmember would have a problem. It is really cheap insurance for the non-member to protect himself from such a problem.

c) Out of courtesy to the host, if you see a potential hazard or something that you think could cause a problem, talk to the host and try to fix the problem.

If we all work together we can have a fun and safe show at the same time. Small children have the most curious minds. When they see a moving object they want to reach out and touch it. This is one of the reasons we rope around our exhibits.
