Today as I write this it is the 4th day of summer, and it is hot here in SW Missouri.

We spent 2 weeks in Texas for the National show with 95-100 every day with the wind blowing all the time. I don't think I broke a sweat. It has been 95-100 here the last week and water runs off me.

I got to visit with several branches while at the show. The first thing we discussed was that "EDGETA" is not an "Insurance Company". Sometimes I would have to go over the program 2 or 3 times before people understood how it all works. I was introduced several times as the president of the organization where we get our insurance. This statement is not true. I am presently president of the board of directors of the Early Day Gas Engine & Tractor Association, Inc. Our purpose is to collect, restore and exhibit old farm related equipment. Then by being a member of the "Early Day Gas Engine & Tractor Association, Inc." you as individuals are covered under the master liability policy of the organization. The liability policy will also reach out and cover a complete show for liability if all exhibitors are members of the "Early Day Gas Engine & Tractor Association, Inc." This is where we are getting in trouble. We have those "free loaders" that want to come to our shows and exhibit there equipment but don't want to pay to be a member. This puts our benefit program on the line if one of those "free loaders" would have an incident. We don't want this to happen. If the branches let this happen and can't control there exhibitors then they must go out and purchase a Third Party Insurance to cover the "Free Loaders. This is an un-needed expense which is around \$1500. Our benefit program covers the members against the spectators for the whole year at any show that they attend as long as they follow the "Safety Requirements set forth by the organization". All you newsletter editors have permission to reprint this article.

We had 15 branches represented and 47 members at the National Meeting.

Ed Stewart came forward and gave us an invitation to the 2010 show at the Santa Margarita Ranch, CA. Our

50th Anniversary Show is to be held on a working cattle ranch in Santa Margarita, CA between Paso Robles and San Luis Obispo, CA. The hosting branches are 27, 8 & 3. Show dates are June 24-27, 2010. This date needs to be written on your calendar now. That's all for now folks. Be safe and have a good year.

Insurance Update, March 2009-By Dick Tombrink

I have just returned from the National meeting that was held this year in Fredericksburg, Texas, hosted by branch 66. It was a great show, lots of tractors, and stationary engines, as well as a tractor pull. The weather was a little warm for those of us from Montana this early in the year; it was between 95-100 each day. There was a breeze blowing each day, which helped. The members of branch 66 did a great job to make everyone feel welcome.

As you know this year our insurance premium was reduced to \$4 per member. At the National meeting the directors reviewed the insurance costs and the premium will remain at \$4 for next year (2010) as well. So again the total per member to be paid by the branches will be \$4 for the insurance premium and \$4 for the National dues, for a total of \$8 per member. This reduction in insurance premium is as a result of all of us keeping safety first on our mind. It really pays off as everyone goes home happy at the end of the day. Thanks to all of you for making that happen.

In the past our insurance has allowed us to sign up mom and pop vendors who sell arts and crafts at our events/shows and cover them with our insurance. This was reviewed by our insurance carrier and we no longer can cover these vendors with our insurance. To explain this further, we will be adding the following to our Ouestions and Answers section under insurance:

Q. Can I sign up vendors that sell food, arts and crafts, flea market articles, etc at our events as members of EDGETA to get insurance coverage for them at our events?

A. No. EDGETA insurance no longer covers these vendors. We can no longer sign them up as members of the branch to get coverage for them. EDGETA insurance will cover the branches for an incident involving the vendors, but again will not cover the vendors. Branches need to be more insistent to get a certificate of insurance from these vendors. This is especially important and a requirement for food vendors. The only exception to the above is for a tractor and engine parts swap meet, all swap meet sellers must be EDGETA members. In no case does the EDGE&TA insurance policy provide general liability coverage for the products sold/traded.

We try to keep the information on the website updated, but sometimes it takes time to sort it all out. If you have any questions they probably are addressed there. Let's take a little time to review some safety tips. Before the show begins there should be a safety meeting. This is to inform all exhibitors of the safe practices expected and required during the show. Have safety officers to help the exhibitors and to watch for things that may have been over looked. For example, an engine that is running but has not been roped off, or 2 or more people riding on a tractor that is not equipped to carry 2 people safely. Make sure you have fire extinguishers readily available in case of fire! Have a clear loading and unloading zone for tractors away from the show area because you never know what can happen while loading and unloading. People are curious by nature and they like to see things up close. That is also the reason for double ropes with at least 3 feet around a running engine display. This actually does 2 thing. It keeps the spectators at a safe distance and gives the exhibitor room to move around the display safely. Please review all safety requirements on the web page to familiarize yourself with them. This will insure we are all practicing safety. Remember it is up to us to continue to keep our hobby safe for the spectators and for ourselves. I hope everyone has a great summer.
