From George Christmas, President and SE Regional Director

Well, winter is over, although it was very mild here in South Carolina. Now we battle the pollen and allergies that go with it. Those winter projects should have come together really well with the mild weather. The 2016 show season is going strong. I know everyone is eager to show off that winter project or just ready to be out of the house. Whatever the reason is, it is time to visit with old friends make new ones and enjoy all the old iron on display.

The National Show will be hosted by Branch 52 in Wasilla, Alaska this year. The members are working hard to put on an outstanding show. Please come and show your support June 10-12. I am told that is the height of tourist season in Alaska. Wasilla is 45 miles north of Anchorage and rich in agriculture, mining and railroad heritage. I hope to see many of you there.

Everyone should have their memberships and dues paid by now. It is very important when you report your members that you include their name, address and phone number. These are important pieces of information. Please note the information needed on the BRANCH MEMBERS FORM. It is also required for the insurance coverage to be in effect for each member. It is also required that each branch complete the BRANCH DIRECTORS **UPDATE FORM.** This form serves to help us identify who can be contacted at the branch. It verifies the officers for the D & O insurance. The form is set currently that if there is not a change for a specific position you can fill it in with the word "same," submit it, and the form will let the secretary know the correct contacts for your branch.

It would be a good idea for each branch to have someone to visit the web site on a regular basis. The web site is the easiest and fastest way we have to reach all the members. There are web pages set up for each branch. These pages can be used to post pictures, show schedules your branch will attend during the year and general information about your

branch. You can include things like history of the club and specific items the club collects. If your club does a good bit of charity work, you can tell all about that too. You may even inspire other clubs to do the same thing or give them an idea of their own. The web pages are a great way for the clubs to learn about each other too. As small as the world seems to be at times, some folks don't get to travel around the United States, and having the ability to see clubs from other states or even in their own states through the use of a branches web page can be a treat. You know they say a picture is worth a thousand words. There are many members who would be glad to share the knowledge they have with others. The web pages may also help contact with someone with a rare part needed to complete a project. It may also be a way to get more exposure for your branch to get young folks interested in the hobby.

Please note we have made some updates to the frequently asked question section of the web site. One question raised this year was concerning reporting events, specifically tractor drives. The insurance committee worked closely with our insurance agent to get clear direction concerning these and other events. We currently are not required to report the events we intend to participate at. However, the board strongly recommends you report your events via the web site. Also, for tractor drives to be considered branch sponsored events, the branch meeting minutes should reflect it was discussed and approved by the membership to be covered. If the tractor drive is organized by a nonmember, it must be approved by the branch as a branch activity for the branch members to have EDGETA insurance coverage. If you have any questions concerning coverage, please contact one of the directors. We will be glad to answer any of your questions.

I mentioned in the January newsletter that the board had made the suggestion to lower the number of members required for branches to renew to 10 members. The number of members to form a branch will remain at 20. Our membership has been

declining due to some branches not able to maintain the minimum 20 members to renew. This will come on a ballot for your branches to vote on because it is a bylaw change and has to be approved by the membership to be in effect. As an order of housekeeping, the ballot will contain an item for approval from the membership concerning the secretary/treasurer's salary. Due to the decline in membership, the secretary/treasurer's salary has also declined; however, she still devotes the same amount of time to the job. The board of directors voted at the 2015 annual meeting to change the salary from 20% of the membership fees to \$9500 or 20% whichever is greater. The secretary/treasurer spends at least 20 hours a week on the association's business.

I always end with a thought on safety. It is extremely important we do all we can to make this hobby safe for the spectators, but also for ourselves. We need to make sure we are following the guidelines set forth and posted on the web site for everyone to view at any time. We must practice safe handling of equipment so we don't injure ourselves. I recently was loading a tractor for a show and realized if the weather conditions changed, loading that tractor would not be safe. I had to change the way I loaded it plus decide on another tractor to take with it since the load would be stacked differently. This is only one example of thinking ahead to what may happen "if." We must constantly do that. That type thinking will keep us ahead of the game and safer. Please remember safety is everyone's business. If you witness another member in an unsafe practice, behavior, or display, you need to bring that to the branch safety officer's attention so it can be corrected. I recently went to a show which was not an EDGE&TA show. Some of the things I saw really scared me. I wondered how anyone could think some of the stuff going on there would have been safe. There were multiple people riding on the same tractor. There were moving displays not roped off. There was a large crowd and a lot of unnecessary movement on the show grounds. It only takes one incident to change to course of a show. Please make sure you are following the guidelines to make your show or display wherever you are, safe for you and the spectators.

I look forward to seeing some of you at the national and regional shows this year.

Insurance Update, March 2015, By Dick Tombrink, NW Regional Director

Spring is here and the show season is starting. Remember to keep thinking safety in all that you do. Don't let your guard down. It is better to take two minutes to think about what you are about to do than to have an accident and wish you had thought it through.

Most of you have sent your EDGETA dues (\$12 per year per member) to Carrie Jo. If you have not, please send them as soon as you can. Remember after you receive dues from your branch members, be sure to send them to Carrie Jo within 30 days so they have insurance coverage. This is a requirement of our by-laws.

Recently the insurance committee has been dealing with an issue that started with a question from a branch where several members would decide to have a tractor drive and would go ahead with it without it being discussed and approved in a branch meeting. Some branch members thought it should be discussed and agreed to by the branch. The way our FAO's were written it was acceptable to do that.

I ran the question by our insurance agent for his take on it. His response was, "In light of the recent accident in PA, The Underwriter & Claims have clarified their position on this: It must be an activity of EDGETA. This would be for either sponsored or non-sponsored events. They really do not want to have coverage for individuals running around on their own. It needs to be an activity the branch is doing." The incident in PA was an accident where a tractor was rear-ended on a public road. From what we know, the incident was not connected to an EDGETA event. At this time, to our knowledge, no claim has been filed against our insurance. But it got our insurance carrier's attention.

From our insurance agent's reply, it not only covers tractor drives, but also members going to other non EDGETA events. Now these situations must be discussed in a branch meeting and agreed that it is a branch activity for the members to have coverage. To have documentation, we have added the requirement that it must be documented in the branch minutes prior to the event. We are calling it an EDGETA activity, not an EDGETA sanctioned event like a branch show where all exhibitors, etc. must be members.

As a result, we have gone through the FAQ's and below are those that were deleted or modified. Several were deleted because we no longer report events as we were required to do under a previous insurance carrier. The modified ones address the issue explained above. These changes have been made on the EDGETA website.

Changes to the FAQ's on the EDGETA website are as follows. (These are the old item numbers, since the changes have renumbered some FAQ's.)

Number 2 was **deleted** since we do not have to report events anymore.

2. If individual EDGE&TA members go to a non-sponsored event should this be reported?

No. Every EDGE&TA member has Liability Insurance anywhere they go. They must follow the EDGE&TA Safety requirement if they expect coverage

Number 3 was **deleted** since we do not have to report events anymore.

3. If we take our Branch Owned People Mover to a non-sponsored event does this have to be reported?

No, you no longer need to report it as an Event.

Number 20 was **modified** as follows:

20. When EDGETA members go to a nonsponsored event, do they have EDGETA insurance coverage? Rev. 2-29-2016

Yes, if the branch approves it as a branch activity and it is noted as such in the branch minutes prior to the event.

Number 22 was **modified** as follows:

22. Is an EDGETA group tractor drive considered an event? Rev 2-29-2016

Yes it is considered a Branch EDGETA event. But prior to the tractor drive the minutes of a Branch meeting must show that it was discussed and approved by the membership to be covered by our EDGETA insurance. If it is organized by a non member, it must be approved by the Branch as a Branch activity for Branch members to have EDGETA insurance coverage.

Number 23 was **deleted** since it is covered in number 22. It is no longer applicable as written.

23. If a non-member organizes a tractor ride for a group of friends, including some Branch members, are the group members covered? **Yes.** The EDGETA members are covered; it is the same as an EDGETA member attending a non EDGETA event; they are covered by EDGETA insurance as long as they follow the EDGETA safety requirements.

Number 25 was **modified** as follows:

25. We can "what if" things to death but are concerned about the increase in tractor drives where members may be the organizer or just a participant.

Basically, are there instances where the member is not covered? Rev 2-29-2016

If organized by a Branch member and the tractor drive is not approved as a Branch event in a Branch meeting prior to the event, the members do not have coverage. If it is organized by a non EDGETA member, and the tractor drive is not approved as a Branch activity in a Branch meeting prior to the event, the Branch member does not have coverage.

I hope everyone has a great and safe show season this year.
