From George Christmas, President and SE Regional Director

I hope everyone had an enjoyable Christmas. The time really seems to speed by. It won't be long before the show season is in full swing again. Now is the time to check all of your equipment to ensure it is in perfect working order. It is always a good idea to review the safety section of the website www.edgeta.com. Please make yourself familiar with the requirements and suggestions on how to keep our hobby safe for the spectators as well as other members.

Please remember to include your branch number when corresponding to the national secretary or any of the directors. If you are completing any forms for EDGE&TA, you must include you branch number on those as well. The branch number issued when your club joined EDGE&TA is how your branch agreed to be identified during the application process. This speeds up any process concerning your branch.

Remember, it is time to start sending in dues. All dues must be received by March. The total cost per member is \$12. That is \$4 for the dues to EDGE&TA and \$8 per member for the insurance premium. If we can stay accident free, our hope is the insurance premium will decrease in the future. Please contact your regional director if you have any questions.

Please make sure you are updating your officer's information form on the website. It is important for the directors to have up to date contact information for each branch. It is also important from an insurance stand point. If the officer's information is not up to date, the officers are not covered by the D&O insurance provided to the officers for each branch.

The board of directors have been discussing the idea of lowering the number of members required to apply or to keep branch status. As you know, the current minimum number is 20 members. We have several branches that are struggling to hold that number and have had some branches to drop their

membership because they could not keep the 20 members necessary. This bylaw change will require a vote of the membership to change. Please think about how changing it will affect your branch and the association as a whole.

Please share this information with all members. The Board of Directors are members of the association. We are elected by a vote of the membership. Each director serves a term of 3 years. The directors come from the region they live in with the exception of the director at large who may live in any of the regions. This is a membership run association. Please look for the information in the newsletters to see when the director position in your respective regions will be up for re-election. I encourage all those interested to get involved. It takes all of us to keep our association strong.

I hope everyone has a Happy and Prosperous New Year! I am looking forward to seeing old friends and making new friends this year! Please take every precaution to make our hobby safe for everyone.

Insurance Update, December 2015, By Dick Tombrink, NW Regional Director

We are in the middle of winter, Christmas is behind us, and as I write this the New Year is about to begin. I wish to all of you a very happy and safe New Year. This is the time when we all retreat to our shop and work on getting the next project engine/tractor ready for the shows in 2016.

Now back to insurance, periodically I still am asked the question about whether our insurance covers people movers, barrel rides and pulling sleds at non EDGETA shows. I know I have addressed this in previous newsletters, but will do it again to remind everyone. Think of it this way. Our insurance covers us when we have an EDGETA

event. If you are asked to take your branch's people mover, barrel ride or tractor pull sled to the local fair grounds, etc, for their benefit, our insurance does not cover it. Their insurance needs to cover it. That is when you ask them to give you a certificate of their insurance naming your branch as additional insured under their insurance. If you as an individual take your people mover, etc, to the fairgrounds to be used for their benefit, you need to ask them to give you a certificate of insurance naming you as additional insured under their policy. Then you can go to their event. If there is an insurance claim, it is up to their insurance to cover it.

If you still have questions on this or any other insurance item, please give me a call or send me an email. I will get back to you to with an answer to your question.

National dues will remain the same as last year, \$12 per member (\$8 for the insurance and \$4 for National dues). Please remember to send you EDGETA dues to CJ Parmley by March 15.

We ended up the 2015 year without any claims. That is great!! It means that everyone is paying attention to what they are doing and keeping safety in mind for all they do. Congratulations to all of you.

Remember the National EDGETA meeting and show will be in Alaska next June 10-12th. If you have not been to Alaska here is your excuse to go.

Remember to think safety in all you do.

Inventory (Brag Book) of Your Hobby

I'm sure you have read many articles to make a list of things in your home including your vehicles, etc. in case you have an emergency for insurance purposes or to just get back on your feet. Also important is creating a binder/book of your hobby. Take pictures of **all** the items in your hobby. Create a book/binder/tablet like grandparents do as a brag book.

Your book should include picture(s) with a page of stats - name, model, serial number, horse power, etc. How rare it is! How many were built! Where you bought it! How much you paid--maybe even a little story or history about the item.

At every show you go to, you network. If you have your book/binder with you, you may help someone else who has a problem with their piece of equipment, or you find someone to help you with your own problem. Maybe you run into someone who knows where you can obtain a piece of equipment that you have not been able to find — it's a great conversation starter. We in this hobby like to

talk, especially about our hobby.

At a show when your piece of equipment is on display, you can be very informative, plus you might learn from someone who has the same piece of equipment.

If grandparents can brag about their grandchildren – you can use this book to brag about your hobby.

Another reason you should create this book about your hobby is in case something happens to you, your spouse (husband in my case) can use this information to be informative when they have to sell your collection. It really hurts when I hear that someone has passed and the surviving spouse gave the equipment away. I've seen more times that I like to think about when a widow doesn't know anything about the things her husband has collected and she just gives it away or it goes for scrap (that hurts!).

Plan ahead to preserve our hobby – our historical collection! Future generations will profit.

The EDGETA National Annual Meeting is in June this year in Alaska, so we have an important item of business that must be considered before you receive the Newsletter the first part of March.

The following two Director's positions open this year: **Northeast and Southeast.**

If there are any nominations, I must receive the resumes 90 days prior to the National Meeting to be held on June 11, 2016. Please address to Carrie Jo Parmley, 15246 Seven League Rd., Tyler, TX 75703. The date due to me is Monday, March 14, 2016. A banner scrolling across the website starting January 2016 is also a reminder that the NE and SE director positions are up for election.

By-Laws pertaining to the election are printed below and are also on our website.

ARTICLE IV – DIRECTORS/OFICERS/ADVISORS Section 1. Directors:

- a. The Board of Directors shall consist of seven (7) directors which includes the President, Vice President, and Safety Officer.
- b. There shall be one Director from each of the six (6) EDGE&TA Regions with the seventh being a Director at Large.
- c. Directors shall be elected at the Annual Meeting by a majority of the branches voting, either in person or by proxy. Every branch may vote to fill all Director positions, both Regional and Director at Large.
- d. Any member in good standing may have their name placed in nomination for the Director position in the Region in which they reside.
- e. Any member in good standing, from any region, may have their name placed in nomination for the Director at Large position.
- f. Nominees must send to the Secretary/Treasurer a resume providing a straightforward profile of themselves and a recent photo. As a minimum, the resume should contain the following:
 - (1) EDGE&TA membership history
 - (2) EDGE&TA offices held
 - (3) Ideas and goals for EDGE&TA
 - (4) Knowledge of current EDGE&TA issues
- g. The Secretary/Treasurer must receive the resumes and photos no later than (90) days prior to the Annual Meeting. h. If there are no valid regional nominations presented, the Board of Directors shall appoint a member in good standing from the region to serve until the next Annual Meeting at which time the position shall become vacant.
- i. If there are no valid nominations presented to fill the Director at Large position, the Board of Directors shall appoint a member in good standing to serve until the next Annual Meeting at which time the position shall become vacant.
- j. For continuity, Directors shall be elected on a rotating basis under the following cycle: Two (2) Directors shall be elected/re-elected in each of the first year, and the second year. In the third year, three (3) Directors shall be elected/re-elected
- k. The Board of Directors shall fill a vacated Director position by appointment of an EDGE&TA member in good standing. Directors so appointed shall serve until the next Annual Meeting at which time the position shall become vacant.
- 1. Directors shall serve a term of three (3) years, and/or until their successors are elected, with the exception that a Director elected to fill a vacated appointed position shall serve the remainder of that three (3) year term.
- m. The number of terms a Director may serve is unlimited.
