Hello EDGE&TA Members,

Hope your year is going well and you are enjoying lots of old engine and tractor shows, parades and pulls. We just went to the National Show at the historical Pottsville Museum and grounds in Merlin, Oregon. It was a great show that was well attended by exhibitors and spectators. What a great turnout of tractors and engines. There were two threshers, a combine, sawmill, shingle mill, blacksmith shop, and huge swap meet. Before the Parade of Power tractor parade each day there was a tribute to the Veterans. There were about 100 Veterans that came out to stand in front of the grandstands on Saturday while the Boy Scout color guard presented the colors. This was followed by the National Anthem, Flag salute and tribute to the Veterans. Each afternoon there were tractor pulls. The Saturday evening dinner was attended by over 130. Thank you, Branch 9 for all the work you did to put on a great National Show. Next year the National Show will be held in the Eastern Region at Medina, Ohio July 19th-20th 2024. Case and Ohio made equipment will be featured.

The National Meeting was called to order after The Pledge of Allegiance. Then the roll call showed we had 24 Branches represented at the meeting. The Directors attending were, President and Director at Large, Jeff Fenske, Vice President and NW Director, Morrie Robinson, SW Director, Ron Hanson and Eastern Director, Travis Brown. Also in attendance was Cliff Northcote former National President and current President of Branch 22. Absent were Central Director, John Roderick and Secretary/Treasurer Carrie Jo Parmley. Thank you, Morrie Robinson, for your years of service to EDGE&TA as Show Coordinator, Hall of Fame Chairman and NW Director. Welcome our new NW Director, Mike Pollack from Anchorage, Alaska. Those of you in the NW Region will be

getting calls from Mike, so answer your phone when you get a call from Alaska! Ron Hanson will be the new Vice-President. All this information will be on the EDGE&TA website. At the end of the year Carrie Jo Parmley will be retiring after 12 years as our Secretary/Treasurer. Our new Secretary/Treasurer will be Michelle McGill from Branch 9, Oregon. Her information will be on the website later.

We ended last year with 6,300 members. We now have 5,460 members. This is down from over 12,000 members ten years ago. We now have four Regions instead of six due to lower membership and finding people willing to be a volunteer Director. See the website for the new map of Regions and Branches.

There was a discussion at the Board Meeting about the speed of tractor pulls. We voted on moving the speed from 3 MPH to 6 MPH. We feel like this is still a safe speed but might bring in more people to pull, especially bring younger people into the club. If you have any questions or comments, please contact your director or me.

Starting April 15th 2024 we will be raising the National dues from \$17 to \$20 per person for the year. This increase is due to inflation and our lower membership.

The South West Regional Show will be held in Valley Center, CA, north of San Diego, on September 23rd-24th 2023. This will be hosted by Branch 22.

There were four Hall of Fame recipients this year. Two of these attended the National dinner and were presented the award by Morrie Robinson. Jude Durfey from Branch 54 in Washington and Les Layton from Branch 15 in Oregon received their plaques at the dinner. Alvin Bartleson from Branch 28 in Missouri and Duane Nelson from Branch 1 in Minnesota were mailed plaques to their branch. Congratulations to all the winners.
