Subj. 1998 National Minutes

EDGE&TA Members,

The 38th annual EDGE&TA National Business Meeting was held June 13, 1998 at the Chowchilla Fairgrounds in Chowchilla CA and was hosted by Branch 18. The meeting was opened by Branch President Jim Moore. He introduced the National Acting President Curtis Cook.

Curtis thanked Branch 18 for their job well done and then introduced the directors, advisors, and special guest Jerry Mac Martin.

Roll call of branches was taken, there were 28 branches present.

OLD BUSINESS:

There was no old business discussed.

NEW BUSINESS:

INSURANCE:

BALLOTS:

A Branch 31 member talked about a new type of construction fencing and suggested that the National adopt the usage of this. Curtis mentioned that we have had one insurance claim this year. An incident between a tractor and a car and it was great that we come up with some ideas of our own to show that we are working for better ways to improve our safety.

Bud Minor, safety man for Branch 18, commented on the cooperation he got from members displaying. Bud was everywhere, and did a great job of making sure that the exhibitors complied with the safety rules.

Curtis said that's what it's all about. Helping each other out. Sleepy Avant announced there were 145 tractors and 390 gas engines at last count.

Mike Mc Kenney, director from branch 27 thanked Menno for all his help and branch 22 for their monetary help to put on their regional show this year.

There was a lot of inter-action from the members in the audience, and a lot of laughter. All in all the 1998 National Show was a great success!!
