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BCC nursery school expels tot, faces suit

NEWTOWN — A Yardley mother is suing the day care center club at Bucks County Community College for expelling her three-year-old son.

Bonnie Keating of Cadwallader Court said her son, Teddy, was dismissed from the nursery school program after she did not attend a parent orientation session.

Mrs. Keating said the orientation was held on Sept. 10, nine days after the nursery school started on Sept. 2.

The suit, filed Monday with District Justice William Thomas in Newtown, charges the day care center club with breach of contract. No hearing date has been set by Thomas.

Also at stake is the 60 per cent tuition lost, \$125, when the child was dismissed from the program.

The club is a student organization at the college, operating a state regulated day care center program.
