Ribbentrop in Spain, Says Moscow Radio

NEW YORK.—(AP)—The Moscow radio, in a broadcast heard by CBS, reported today that former Nazi Foreign Minister Joachim von Ribbentrop and 100 other Germans "are still at large in Spain."
