Last of Foe Left On Isle Attempt Escape by Sea In

Small Boats

GUAM, TUESDAY— (UP)—Japanese soldiers attempted unsuccessfully to escape from a dic-or-surrender trap on Southern Okinawa by putting to sea in small boats, it was disclosed today. The escape effort was made as five American divisions converged on remaining enemy

Small groups of enemy soldiers, some of them naked and carrying only hand grenades were captured by American pa-trol craft off the southern tip of the island.

The Japanese troops obviously were trying to escape the beating being administered their disorganized forces by United States marines and soldiers, who fanned out along the south coast of the island. The Yanks' objective was the envelopment and annihilation of the last 15,000 to 20,000 Japanese on Okinawa.

GUAM — (P) — In the greatest one-day advance in the Okinawa campaign, American Infantrymen splashed two miles through drenching rains yesterday to the southeastern shore of the island, scaling off Chinen Peninsula which forms the southern arm of the finest fleet anchorage in the south-
