But they apparently include the "right of passage" of troops through a country, provision for expulsion of a member of the new league, whether to seek a Big 5 veto over amendment of the charter and over nomination of a secretary general, whether agreements for provision of military contingents should be negotiated between states or between a state and the security council, whether the assembly should be considered
