

Heart Attack Proves Fatal

Burkert Was Cited in 1937 for Million Miles Of Safe Driving

Special to the Times. TITUSVILLE, Jan. 8.—George W. Burkert, of this place and former Trentonian, died suddenly of a heart attack at 9 o'clock this morning at his residence, "Cedar Crest Farm," here. He was in his 63d year. Funeral arrangements are in charge of Allen Hooper.

Surviving is his widow, Elizabeth Taylor Burkert. For some time Burkert had been engaged in the pork-packing business in Trenton. Ill-health forced him to abandon it some time ago. A licensed automobile driver since 1905, Burkert received a certificate from J. Harry Hearn, chairman of the Safety and Traffic Advisory Committee of Trenton, on November 17, 1937, for having completed one million miles of accident-free driving.

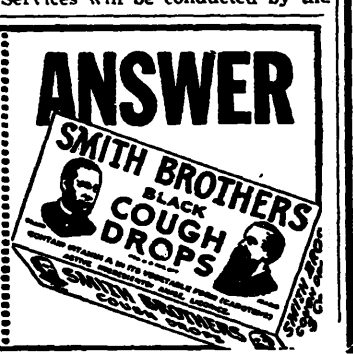
