## **Disunity Appears** In GOP

Cracks in New Jersey Repub lican unity are beginning to show, hard on the heels of the party's selection of a unity candidate to run for the U.S.

Senator Clifford P. Case (R N. J.) indicated in Washington last night he will not be bound by the choice of Bernard M Shanley by a screening committee of 31 top Republicans — including Case himself.

Case did not personally attend the meeting of the Republican screening committee here Monday night.

**Favored Savino** But the Senator said his proxy was cast at the session in favor of Carmine Savino Jr. of Bergen County, former Re publican Assembly leader.

Shanley, 60, of Bernardsville was chosen as a unity candidate with an eye toward avoiding the possible bitterness and wrangling of a primary fight. GOP had a three - way primary fight in 1958 and subs lost the election to Harrison A. Williams, the Democrat.

Shanley was involved in that primary battle, losing to Rep. Rogert W. Kean.

Case, the only New Jersey Republican holding statewide elective office, said he believes Savino to be the strongest can didate among those available

for the job.

He denied any attempt to block Shanley for the nomina-tion, but added that he was interested in getting the strong-est possible candidate.

# U.S. Dependents Flee Violence On Cyprus

## **Evacuation** To Beirut **Under Way**

NICOSIA, Cyprus (AP) - An mergency airlift began removing hundreds of American women and children from this Mediterranean trouble spot today as anti-American violence contin ued on Cyprus.

Terrorists bombed the U.S. Embassy in Nicosia Tuesday night, slightly injuring a Marine guard, then set ablaze two cars owned by U.S. government em-

U.S. Ambassador Fraser Wilkins ordered a voluntary evacu-ation of American dependents to Beirut, Lebanon, explaining he no longer had confidence in the ability of Greek Cypriot police to keep order.

Archbishop Makarios, Greek Cypriot president, in-spected damage to the embassy and denounced the bombing as the work of "heinous criminals."
