COMIC TRAGEDY OF WEDLOCK AT TRENT

"The First Year," by Frank Craven, will be the presentation marking the fourth week of the Trent Theatre Stock Company, beginning tonight. The company will give an additional matinee performance next week on Friday, making five afternoon presentations, beginning Tuesday. It tells a simple human, straightforward story, without any frills or furbelows. It is the story of people you know—perhaps your neighbors.
