Jersey Chutist To Be Buried On Saturday

BRICK TOWNSHIP (AP) — Nick Piantanida, New Jersey parachutist who died Monday after being in coma for four months, will be buried Saturday in the Holy Cross Cemetery in North Arlington.

A requiem mass will be sung for Piantanida at St. Anthony's Roman Catholic Church in Union City.

The 33-year-old parachutist never regained consciousness after a high-altitude accident on May 1. He died at the Veterans Administration Hospital in Philadelphia.

His last words — "Emergency! Emergency!" — were gasped through a radio 57,000 feet above southern Minnesota. He was on his way to a 120,000-foot height from where he hoped to break the world's free-fall record. He suffered brain damage when his oxygen supply failed.

Desi Arnaz Booked For Gun Assault

SAN DIEGO, Calif. — AP — Actor-producer Desi Arnaz was arrested Tuesday night on a charge of assault with a deadly weapon, sheriff's deputies reported.

The Cuban-born Arnaz, 40, divorced from actress Lucille Ball in 1960, fired two shots at a man parked with a friend near the Arnaz residence in suburban Del Mar, sheriff's Sgt. Max Justice reported.

Justice said Arnaz approached the parked car, containing John W. Bovee, 20, of Rancho Santa Fe, Calif., and Stephen Beardsley, 18, of Del Mar, and told them: "I've got a .38 and I'll shoot your fires and car."

Then, said Justice, the star of the old "I Love Lucy" television series fired one shot past Bovee and another at his feet. Both shots went into the ground and struck no one, Justice reported.

He married Edith Mack Hirsch on March 3, 1963, in Las Vegas, Nev.

Crew To Board Orbiting Tank

By AL ROSSITER JR. — CAPE KENNEDY (UPI) — The U.S. Space Agency plans to turn an orbiting fuel tank into a manned laboratory in 1968 to see if spent rockets can be used as low-cost space stations.

The unique experiment, already approved by top National Aeronautics and Space Administration officials, will utilize a Saturn 1 second stage that normally would be discarded once it uses its load of liquid hydrogen and oxygen to propel a three-man Apollo into orbit.

A special oxygen system will pressurize the huge 30-foot long tank to make it habitable and then astronauts will enter it through a special "manhole cover."

Interesting Experiment "I think it will be an interesting experiment," said Dr. George E. Mueller, NASA associate administrator in charge of manned spaceflight. "It will give us some knowledge of the ability of man to work in a large pressurized volume."

The only major new piece of equipment that will be needed for the mission is an airlock being built for NASA by McDonnell Aircraft Corporation, of St. Louis, Mo., under a recently awarded contract worth about \$9 million.

If the experiment proves that such an operation is practicable, it will mean that the 23,000-pound Saturn upper stages no longer need be abandoned in orbit once they perform their primary job of getting a spacecraft up there.

Astronauts would be able to enter the rocket's empty 22-foot diameter hydrogen tank and assemble living and work structures necessary for long duration spaceflights.

Informal sources say the experiment could be carried out in early 1968 on an Apollo-Saturn combination known by NASA as AS209 if the vehicle is not needed for further testing in the manned lunar landing program. It would be the fourth Saturn 1 launch after the initial three-man flight set for December.

Plans call for the airlock to be mounted on top of the Saturn second stage in the area that will be occupied by Apollo Moon landing ships on lunar flights.

Dock Nose-First Once in orbit, the two-section Apollo spacecraft will separate from the rocket, turn around then dock nose-first with the 15½-foot-long airlock.

As soon as all the gases in the second stage are vented, the Apollo astronauts will have to "walk in space" to hook up various equipment to the hydrogen tank. Then, oxygen carried aloft with the airlock will be pumped into the tank to make it habitable for men without bulky space suits.

Mueller said in a briefing last week that the astronauts will perform several experiments to see how well man can work in a pressurized, but weightless volume.

"You are giving yourself a large volume in which to work," he said. "I think it is a good example of getting a large amount of information from a relatively small investment and utilizing the flexibility and capability of basic Apollo systems for new and exciting things."

The Doctor Says Elastic Wrap: Stopgap Aid For Ailing Veins

Q—After my first pregnancy I developed varicose veins. With each succeeding pregnancy I had to wear an elastic stocking, he said Tuesday. "We can assume we have broken the back of the epidemic."

Three Air Force planes completed spraying of this Gulf Coast area Tuesday. Metzger said two deaths resulted from encephalitis and there were 35 confirmed and 55 suspected cases of the disease.

A—Support of the weakened veins with an elastic stocking or a roller bandage with an elastic weave will neither cure your varicose veins nor prevent them from getting worse. If properly applied they will act as a temporary stop-gap. Put it on before you get out of bed in the morning. While doing so keep your leg elevated above the rest of your body. The support should reach from your toes to just below your knees.

Some complications as leg ulcers, infection and the breaking loose of clots which may lodge in vital organs and obstruct their circulation may result when varicose veins are neglected. For this reason a permanent cure should be sought.

Injecting these veins with a clotting substance puts them out of circulation. After that they become scar tissue. Some surgeons disapprove of this method of treatment but if the clotting agent used is tetradecyl sulfate and if the operation is performed in the early stages of the

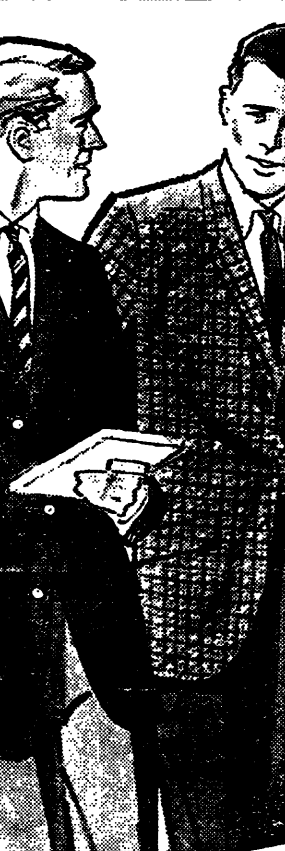
