Is driving over 61 miles an hour reckless driving? Hopewell Township Magistrate Michael A. Travers thinks not.

He dismissed such a charge against Charles H. Snyder, 45, of Phillipsburg last night and fined him \$20 for speeding. Snyder, a Reading Railroad engineer, was arrested for driving 65 miles an hour on Route 30 by Motor Vehicle Inspector Robert

Wagner said he had been instructed to charge anyone driving more than 61 miles an hour with reckless driving. He admitted Snyder was operating his car satisfactorily except for the speed.

Judge Travers said that considering the circumstances he did not think that speed alone constitutes reckless driving.

"Driving 65 miles an hour at 12:30 a. m. on a lightly traveled road does not seem to me to be 'driving carelessly and heedlessly in willful or wanton disregard of the rights and safety of others'," he said, quoting the
