Governor Considers \$3,000,000 Expansion At Trenton Prison

Would Expand Walled Area, Close Part of · Second Street

Governor Meyner is considering the expenditure of approximately \$3,000,000 to modernize the Trenton State Prison.

A part of the program calls for enlarging the walled area by closing a section of Second Street. An early conference is planned by the Governor with Institutions Commissioner Sanford Bates and the department board of control for a full-scale review of the prisor problem.

The Governor in his budget message vetoed a request appropriation of \$3,000,000 to supplement \$1,800,000 of bond money for a proposed \$14,000,000 new prison at Arneytown in Burlington County. The project, launched during the administration of former Governor Driscoll, contemplated the eventual abandonment of the Trenton prison.

Makes Personal Visit

Meyner made a two-hour visit to the institution yesterday. While there, he ate the same mid-day meal served to the prisoners. It consisted of vegetable soup, bread without butter, spaghetti and a ment ball fortified by soy beans, cold slaw, gelatine and tea.
