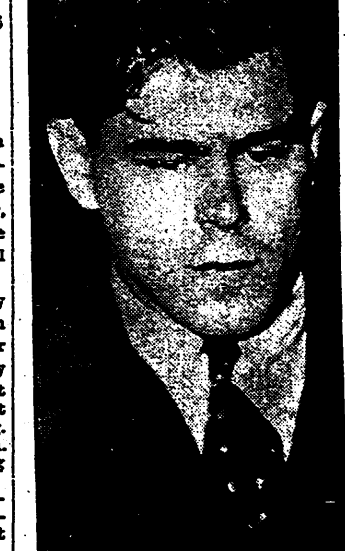
Spanish War Veterans Hold Meeting Tonight
