

### N. J. Sanitarium Offers Free Care Of Sailor's Wife

BERLIN, N. J.—AP—Christmas may not be a happy season for Radloman 2/c Charles G. Miller this year, but helpful strangers may make the next one the merriest of all.

Two years ago, the 24-year-old sailor, on liberty from the U.S.S. Oriskany in Cannes, France, met a pretty French girl, Jeanine Amelle Noelle, also 24.

The couple was married a short time later and letters to Miller's parents were full of happiness and dreams of the day when he could bring Jeanine to the United States.

But recently Jeanine contracted tuberculosis and Miller, not knowing where to turn for aid, asked his parents to do everything possible to secure clearance for Jeanine's entry into the U. S. for immediate medical attention.

The elder Miller mentioned his son's plight to a fellow worker in

a Camden, N. J. candy factory. Louis Childs, of Runnemede, N. J., suggested he contact J. William Elliott, Camden County director of charities.

After repeated failures to solve the problem, Elliott received a letter from Mrs. Clara Falk, superintendent of the Deborah Sanitarium, non-sectarian hospital at Browns Mills, N. J.

Mrs. Falk said she would care for Jeanine free of charge until she is cured.

Word was sent to Miller and he replied that Navy and U. S. Consulate officials were working out details so he and Jeanine can sail from Casablanca, his duty station, for the U. S., December 29.

And the first words they'll see after arriving at the sanitarium are its motto:

"He who serves humanly serves God."

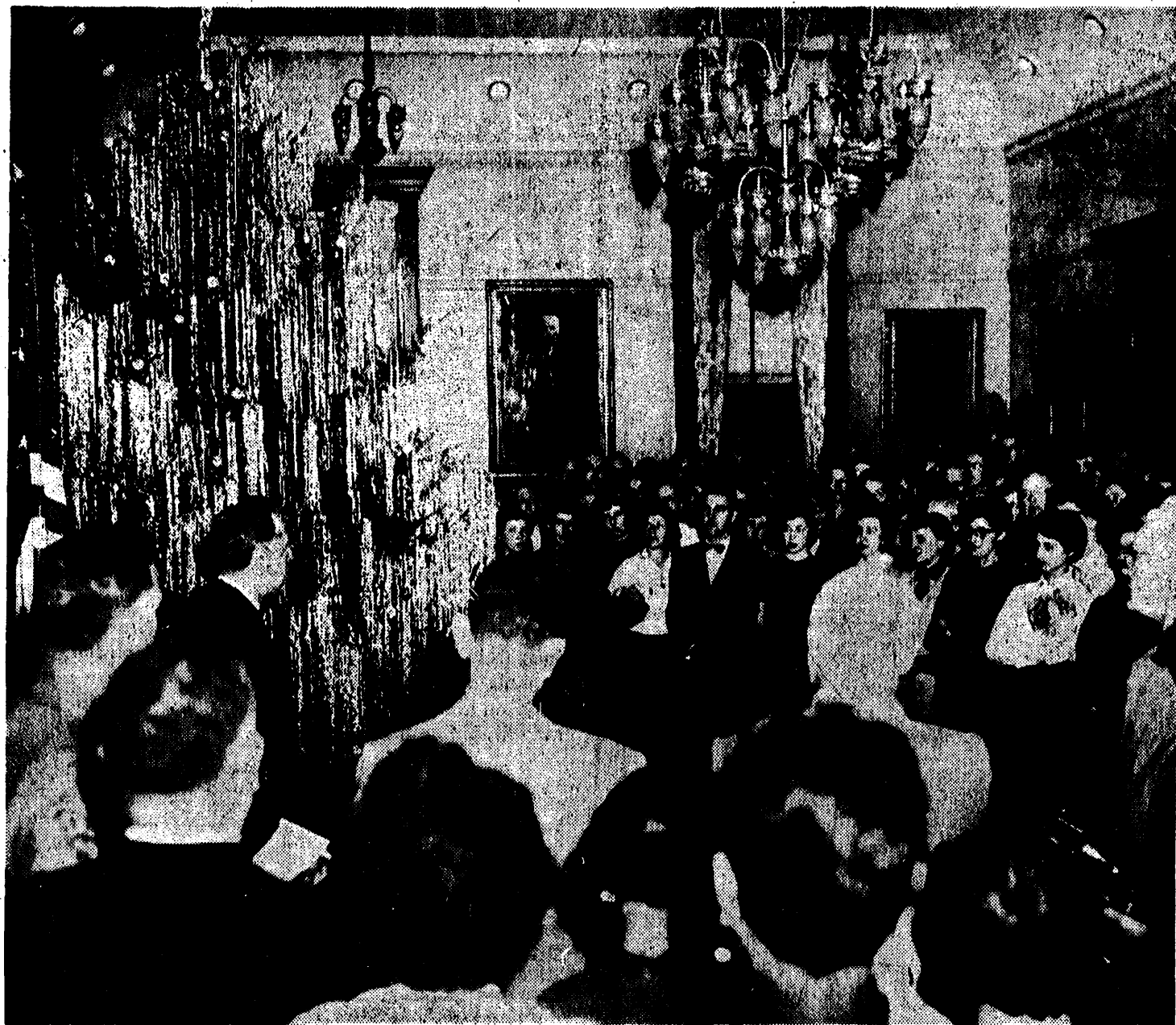
### Truck Driver Hurt In Crash With Car

### Finley, Of Princeton, Named As Assistant State Treasurer

State Treasurer Alexander has named Robert L. Finley of Princeton as deputy state treasurer.

The job was held briefly by Aaron Neel before becoming state tax director. The former occupant was James B. Sautter, who retired in 1950.

As presently budgeted, the salary is \$7,500 a year. Alexander said he was suggesting \$14,000 in the new budget.

Finley, 35, was associated with Alexander during the period the treasurer was in Washington as under-secretary of the Army.

A graduate of Harvard College and Law School, he was a member of the legal staff of the War Production Board in 1942-43. He made a special study for the Atomic Energy Commission in 1947 and served with Alexander in the Pentagon from 1949 to 1952. His most recent Federal assignment was deputy assistant to the director of defense mobilization. He was a second lieutenant in World War I and a lieutenant colonel in World War II.
