

### Chaplin Decried Father of Child

#### Conference to Decide on Support—Mother Asks \$2,500 Monthly

LOS ANGELES—(AP)—A legal conference was called in Superior Court today over how much support Charlie Chaplin shall pay for 18-month-old Carol Ann Berry, declared by a jury to be his baby.

The verdict yesterday, cheered and applauded by many spectators, was a bitter reversal for the British-born actor in his court battles resulting from a romantic involvement with the infant's mother, Joan Berry.

A year ago a Federal court jury pronounced him innocent, before a roomful of applauding onlookers, of a Mann act indictment. It charged he had transported Miss Berry, 24, his former drama protegee, to New York and back.

Lawyers said the 36-year-old screen veteran wouldn't be summoned to the support hearing unless an opposing counsel can't agree on the size of his fortune.

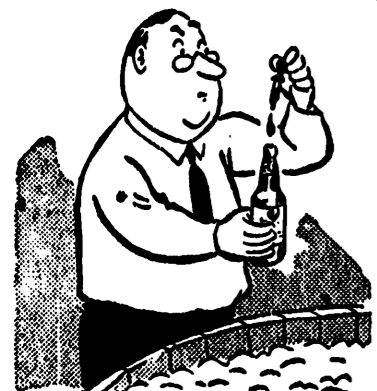
Miss Berry asks \$2,500 monthly for support of Carol Ann. Chaplin has paid her more than \$18,000 for attorney fees and support and still pays \$75 weekly under a pre-trial agreement.

His attorney, Charles E. Millikan, said he had not decided whether to appeal the verdict. He declined to say, until after the support hearing, whether he would move for a new trial.

The jury of 11 women and one man deliberated two hours and 55 minutes before returning their 11 to 1 verdict. (The civil case required only a 9 to 3 decision.) Neither Joan nor Chaplin was present. A former trial ended in a jury deadlock.

### Nazis Plan Last Ditch Battle In 9 Major Fighting Zones

LONDON—(AP)—Establishment of nine major fighting zones where Germany's remaining forces plan to carry on the war to the bitter end, even though geographically isolated, was announced today by Max Krull, DNB commentator.

"The organic structure of the German front has ceased to exist," said Krull. "The terms west front and east front have lost their meaning."

He declared that the "newly German-formed fighting zones" all were "self-contained in an operational sense."

His statement, implying an imminent junction of the Russian and American armies, represented enemy acknowledgment of a belief expressed on the Allied side for some time—that the European war eventually would develop into fighting in a number of isolated pockets.

Two of the zones he mentioned—the Ruhr and the Dutch front—

already are definite pockets. Allied troops are steadily whittling down each and taking out numbers of prisoners.

Another was fortress Bavaria, including Hitler's mountain hide-out at Berchtesgaden. By many accounts, the Germans have hauled vast quantities of supplies into this region and have built the strongest kind of fortifications.

A Stockholm dispatch this morning, however, said the newspaper Dagens Nyheter had quoted a recently returned Swede who has lived in Germany for years as saying the story that the Bavarian Alps have been converted into a final redoubt "appears to be a bluff."
