**YMCA's Board Memorializes Charles Green**

The board of directors of the Trenton YMCA has memorialized its former general secretary, Charles A. Green, in the adoption of a resolution. It will become a part of the permanent records of the association, according to Edward D. Parsons, president of

The resolution follows: Charles A. Green became the general secretary of the Young Men's Christian Association of Trenton, New Jersey in 1916, at which time the association was housed in a building erected in 1895 and which had become totally inadequate.

He recognized no obstacles and by his determination and persistence recruited the support of the leading citizens of Trenton in an effort to secure funds for the erection of a new building. The resulting new building,

located at State and Clinton, is a monument to his leadership. Dedicated in 1932 it has served thousands of Trenton youth and gives promise of continuing to serve many more thousands in the years ahead.

He had vision. He saw the need of a special work for and by Negroes, and the community work started in 1927 at 227 North Willow Street has since become the Carver Branch YMCA located at 44 Fowler Street.

He had the skill necessary to recruit capable associates; qualified committeemen and outstand-

ing board members. Many of Trenton's leading citizens served the YMCA because of Charles A. Green.

In 1936 he reached the age designated as the retirement age for YMCA secretaries. He did not wait to be asked to retire but retired voluntarily that the affairs of the association might remain under the direction of younger men. However, he retained an interest in the progress of the YMCA, even though he used his talents in work of another nature.

On September 22, 1952, Charles A. Green left this world to be

with his God, whom he served so well for so long a time. He will long be remembered and the influence of his life will carry on for many, many years.

The board of directors of the YMCA of Trenton, in meeting assembled on Wednesday, September 24, 1952, received with deep regret the announcement of the death of former General Secretary Charles A. Green, and adopted the above minute, which has been ordered as a permanent part of the record, and has directed that a copy thereof be sent to Mrs. Green and Miss Green.

**County Political Rally Planned At Titusville**

TITUSVILLE — An old-fashioned "country political rally" — complete with hot dogs, hay wagons, a hill-billy band and a drum and bugle corps — will be held in honor of all the Republican candidates Saturday, October 11, at 2 p. m. in Washington Crossing State Park.

Co-chairmen for the rally are N. Mitchell Bannerman and Mrs. Robert D. Vandenberg, Republican county committeeman and committeewoman. Plans for the rally were completed at the home of Colonel Samuel L. South of Harbourton when 34 members of the Republican workers group of the Western District of Hopewell Township met in an executive session.

The rally starts a closing-week intensified drive by Republican leaders in Titusville, Washington Crossing and Harbourton, Bannerman said, and will be in honor of the Eisenhower-Nixon ticket; U. S. Senator H. Alexander Smith, up for reelection; John J. Inglesby, candidate for Congress, and the Mercer County candidates for Freeholder, Stewart H. O'Donnell, Samuel J. Plumeri and George M. Brenfleck.

The rally will be held on the baseball diamond in the Washington Crossing State Park adjoining Sullivan's Grove, Bannerman said. Additional rural atmosphere will

be provided by the well-known Delaware Valley radio entertainers; "Sleepy Hollow Ranch Gang." They will entertain with two half-hour shows. Square dancing will be included on the program.

Hay wagons will be used to transport the guest speaker, candidates and the committeemen and women onto the field, with the Titusville and Washington Crossing Drum and Bugle Corps leading the parade.

Arrangements have been completed, Bannerman said, to hold the program in the nearby Titusville Fire House Auditorium, River Road, in the event of inclement weather.
