

WASHINGTON CROSSING.

Queer what changes a few months will bring about. Last year the State Board of Conservation and Development proposed to sell the Washington Crossing Park, and now Assemblyman Blackwell has introduced a bill providing for the acquisition of additional land at the historic spot.

There is no question but that Mr. Blackwell comes nearer to representing public sentiment than did the State Board, which wanted to spend public money for a park in Sussex County, for the use of wealthy men from New York, Newark and some of the other North Jersey cities.

It may be a question whether the project should be left in the hands of a State board which has shown its hostility to the Washington Crossing Park, but the patriotic societies, aided by Mr. Blackwell, will no doubt see to it that the act is enforced, if it is passed and the Legislature furnishes the money.
