

Plan Discussion Of Mathematics National Council Of Teachers To Have Meetings This Week

The National Council of Teachers of Mathematics will hold its next convention in Atlantic City on Friday and Saturday. A tentative program just released by Miss Mary A. Potter, president of the council, reveals a very comprehensive program.

In addition to informal discussions at a luncheon meeting Saturday, provision has been made for a general meeting, a reception and tea, and a banquet. Sectional meetings will be held for secondary and elementary teachers in both public and private schools.

The central theme is to be "Mathematics in a Defense Program." Dr. Marston Morse, Institute for Advanced Study, Princeton, will be the speaker at the general meeting. He will discuss the work of the war preparedness committee of the American Mathematical Society.

Mathematics in aviation will be discussed by Dr. Carl N. Shuster, State Teachers College, Trenton. The role of the mathematics teacher in our defense program will be considered in a discussion led by C. R. Atherton, Hershey Junior College, Hershey, Pa. Some of the topics to be canvassed in discussions are: Some mathematics taught in defense classes; financing the cost of national defense; why the defense program needs mathematics; mathematics in Connecticut's defense program; in a defense program, what mathematics and how much shall we make available to all competent students in secondary schools.

Mathematics in C.C.C. education will be discussed at the general meeting Friday by Dr. G. N. Ruch, of the United States Office of Education.

The convention banquet will be held at the Hotel Chelsea on Saturday evening. The guest speaker will be Dr. Albert A. Bennett, of Brown University, Providence, R. I. Dr. Bennett is a very delightful person and excellent speaker.

BEAR MOUNTAIN, N. Y., Feb. 18 (AP)—Bear Mountain Museum officials can't understand why someone made off with the museum's entire collection of 12 non-poisonous snakes, especially since the reptiles came from nearby woods teeming with similar specimens.

The great snake-snatch was disclosed yesterday by Museum Director William H. Carr, who said the snakes were not worth more than \$12. Carr has a sentimental attachment for one of them, a pilot blacksnake that goes by the name of Gentle George.

George is about five feet six inches long, dark complexioned, with black eyes and an engaging smile. He got the nickname of "gentle," says Carr, because he wouldn't harm a house, unless he was hungry.
