LECTURE ON "FOREIGNERS"

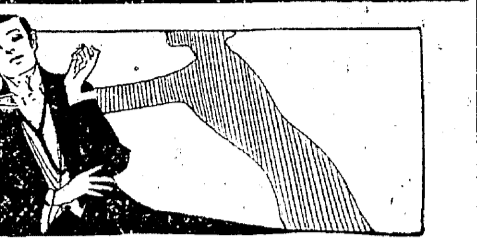
