YARDLEY -- Registration for all Pennsbury Schools kindergar-ten children for next September will be held on Friday from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m.

A child is eligible for enrollment if he will attain the age of five on or before January 31.

Parents are asked to bring a birth certificate at the time of registration. If children have smallpox vaccination certificates, parents are to present them. Kindergarten children will be registered in the buildings attended by other pupils in the same residential area. Children who have recently

moved into the area and have not attended kindergarten this term should also be enrolled for next year's first grade if they will be six on or before January 31.
